BOURBON

WOLF & FERRY OL' FASHIONED

A tribute to our history and this great cocktail.

Rye bourbon, house made brown sugar and orange syrup, orange bitters, and a splash of luxardo cherry juice.

OLD FASHIONED

One of the oldest mixed drinks in the cocktail canon. Made with rye or bourbon, simple syrup, and bitters.

MANHATTAN

This sophisticated drink has stood the test of time. Made with rye bourbon, sweet vermouth, and bitters.

BOURBON SOUR

Think whiskey but better. Made with bourbon, lemon juice, heavy cream, simple syrup, and bitters.

THE BROWN DERBY

This classic cocktail was created in the 1930s. Made with bourbon, grapefruit juice, and honey syrup.

AMARETTO SOUR

An updated twist on the 70's era classic. Amaretto, bourbon, lemon juice, and simple syrup.

MIMOSA 11

FRENCH 75

Named for the fast-firing 75-millimeter field gun that was utilized by the French during World War One. Gin, champagne, and lemon juice.

GIN

GIN & TONIC

Another classic cocktail. Gin and tonic water.

LONDON MULE

This copper mug classic was created in the 1940s. Gin, lime juice, and ginger beer.

GIN RICKEY

Created in the late 19th century in Washington, D.C. Gin, lime juice, and club soda.

THE AVIATION

The Aviation is a classic gin cocktail dating back to the turn of the 20th century, and it first appeared in Hugo Enslin's book "Recipes for Mixed Drinks" in 1916. Gin, Crème de Violette, Maraschino liqueur, and lemon juice.

MOJITO

The 16th century Cuban cocktail. White rum, simple syrup, mint leaves, lime juice, and club soda

THE RIVER SUNSET

Honoring our beautiful downtown sunset. White rum, pineapple and orange juices, cream of coconut, and orange liqueur. Layered with grenadine and topped with orange infused cream.

PAINKILLER

The drink was created in the 1970s at the Soggy Dollar Bar in the British Virgin Islands. Dark rum, pineapple, orange juice, and cream of coconut.

New Orleans' favorite libation. Light rum, dark rum, simple syrup, and fruit juices.

TEQUILA

TEQUILA SUNRISE

The Tequila Sunrise was created in the early 1970s by Bobby Lozoff and Billy Rice at the Trident bar in Sausalito, California. Tequila, orange juice, and grenadine.

PALOMA

This drink is consumed by the droves south of the border. Made with tequila, lime juice, and grapefruit soda.

TEXAS RANCH WATER

The unofficial drink of West Texas. Tequila, lime juice, and sparkling mineral water.

CLASSIC MARGARITA

The Margarita is one of the most popular cocktails in North America. Some say the cocktail was invented in 1948 in Acapulco, Mexico, when a Dallas socialite combined Blanco tequila with Cointreau and lime juice for her guests. But no one really knows. Tequila, Cointreau, lime juice, agave syrup, and salt rim.

THE FIRING SQUAD

Created in 1939 by historian Charles Baker. Blanco tequila, lime juice, and grenadine.

VODKA

MARTINI

This is as classic as cocktails get. Made with vodka, dry vermouth, and bitters.

DIRTY MARTINI

Why not make it dirty? Made with vodka, dry vermouth, and olive brine.

SALTY DOG

It's a lot friendlier than it sounds. Vodka and grapefruit juice.

CUCUMBER, BASIL, & LIME GIMLET

A refreshing twist on the classic Gimlet. Vodka, muddled cucumber and basil, lime juice, and lemonade.

LEMON DROP

The Lemon Drop first squeezed to life in San Francisco sometime during the 1970s.

Invented by Norman Jay Hobday, an out-of-work Vietnam vet turned saloon owner. Triple sec, lemon juice, simple syrup and a sugar rim

COSMOPOLITAN

The original Cosmopolitan was created in 1985 by Miami bartender Cheryl Cook while working at a South Beach bar called the Strand.

Vodka, Cointreau, lime juice, and cranberry cocktail.
